


On the trail of a Creature...

There's lots of animals to be found in the Museum of Zoology. Our Young Zoologist Club members show and tell you about their favourites.


Find them all and add your own in the spaces!

"They are very intelligent animals..."

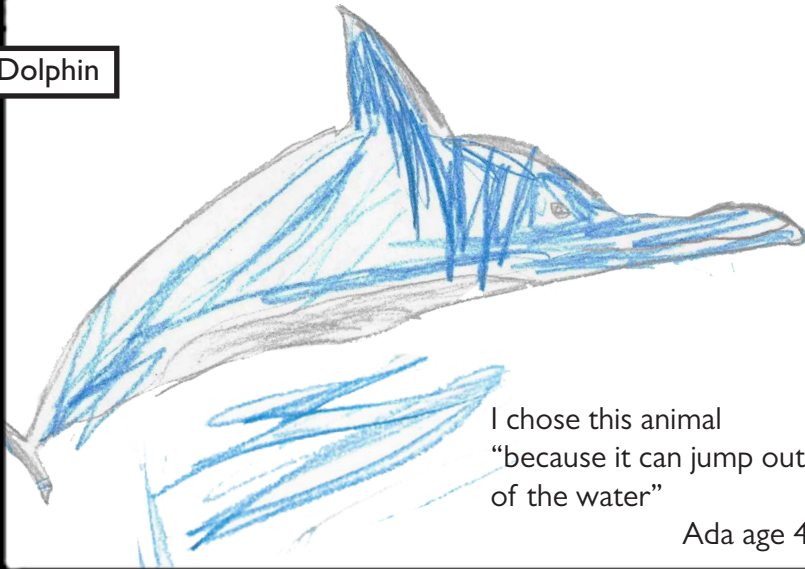
...and they are good climbers (like me), but I don't wee on my hands!!"

Southern Lesser Galago

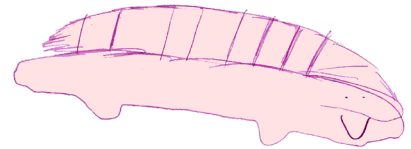
Dolphin

moss on its fur for camouflage!”

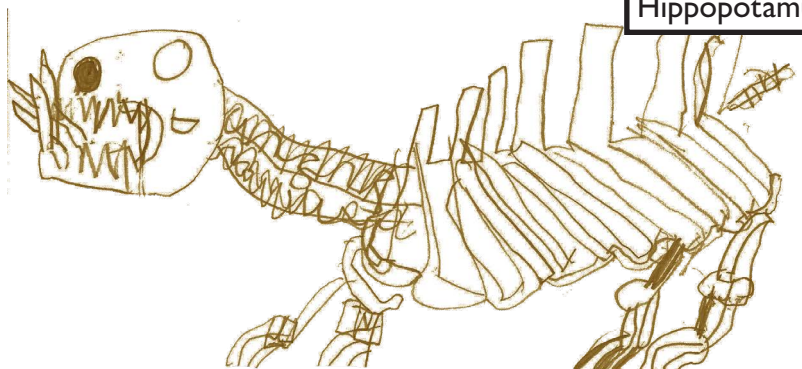
Teddy age 6
